1492. **eido** *i’-do*, a prim. verb; used only in certain past tenses, the others being borrowed from the equiv. 3700 and 3708; prop. *to see (lit. or fig.)*

1097. **ginsko**, *ghin-occe’-ko*; a prol. form of a prim. verb; to “*know*”....-allow, be aware(of), feel, have know(-ledge), to be taking in knowledge

2. *oida* (*oida*, Perf. Of 1492), from the same root as *eidon*, “to see” ...signifying, primarily, “to have seen or perceived”; ...in the case of human “knowledge,” to know from observation, e.g., I Thess. 1:4,5; 2:1; 2Thess. 3:7

1. *ginosko* (1097) signifies “to be taking in knowledge, to come to know, recognize, understand,”...it frequently means “to know in the sense of realizing”

2. *katergazomai* (2716), An emphatic form of No. 1, signifies “to work out, achieve, effect by toil...

3. *energeo* (1754), lit., “to work in” (*en*, and A. No. 1) “to be active, operative,” is used of God....the active response of believers to the in-working of God, Phil. 2:13
